Celebrate community with Temple Emanu-El




This year, I am going to celebrate Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur with my family at Temple Emanu-El.

This year, instead of going to temple I will be participating from home and watching on Zoom.

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

I am going to sit with my family in our house and we will watch the zoom service together.








I can use a fidget or draw quietly in my seat during the service






If I need a break during the service, I will ask mom or dad.
